Dr Smiles Abusomwan served in the Capacity of Ecoba '92 Regional Coordinator for UK and Europe in the year 2017 to 2021.

WORK PROFILE (Summarized version)


- 1. Conducted an Anti-drug abuse campaign in Zimbabwe on the International Day against drug abuse. This was done at a school with over 3800 students. Where they signed their Pledge to say NO to drugs.
- 2. Convened Peace Schools in Ghana and Zimbabwe.
- **3.** Held live National prophetic declaration services in Sierra Leon Freetown. This was broadcast worldwide. During these services declarations were made to neutralize every force that intends to plunge the nations into chaos, God has honored these.
- **4.** Held a Medical Outreach in Bennin City Edo State. Nigeria tor the vulnerable and disadvantaged.
- **5.** Spoke against the religious and honour killing of persons in Nigeria, police brutality and divisive utterances by politicians among other things.

- 10. We have a registered a 24-hour Radio station that portages the vision and Mission of Shallow Waters.






